Asian/Pacific Americans in Iowa: 2024

May 2024

In 1978, a joint congressional resolution established Asian/Pacific American Heritage Week. The first 10 days of May were chosen to coincide with two important anniversaries: the arrival in the United States of the first Japanese immigrants (May 7, 1843) and the completion of the transcontinental railroad (May 10, 1869). In 1992, Congress expanded the 10-day observance to a month-long celebration.

The population of who will identify themselves as Asian alone in Iowa according to the 2022 annual population estimates. This group comprises 2.8% of Iowa's total population.

The percent change in the Asian population from 2000 to 2022. This is a 52,014 numeric increase for the period.



Also among the top 10 countries of birth for Iowa's foreign-born population are China (**8,912**), Vietnam (**7,428**), Bosnia and Herzegovina (**5,715**), Korea (**5,155**), the Philippines (**4,675**), and Burma (**4,514**).



The percentage of Asians in 2022, age 25 and over, who have a graduate degree (e.g., master's, Ph.D., M.D. or J.D.). The corresponding rate for all adults in the age group is **10.8** percent.

The percentage of Native Hawaiian and other Pacific Islanders, age 25 and over in 2022, who have a bachelor's or higher degree education.

47.6%

The percentage of Native Hawaiian and other Pacific Islanders, age 25 and over, who are high school graduates in 2022.

Languages 7,928

The number of people who speak Chinese at home in 2022. Chinese is the most widely spoken Asian language in the state. Also among the most frequently spoken languages are: Vietnamese (7,031), Thai, Lao, or other Tai-Kadai languages (5,923); and Nepali, Marathi, or other Indic languages (4,365). **Age**

The percentage of the native Hawaiian and other Pacific Islander population in 2022 that are under 18; **3.7** percent are 65 or over.


